Dear Administrator Zeldin,

We, the undersigned organizations, are devoted to ensuring clean air and a healthy environment for communities across the country and expect the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to share this commitment and fulfill its responsibilities under law. We are outraged by the proposal to weaken the Mercury and Air Toxics Standards (MATS) for power plants. This proposal would increase toxic pollution, poisoning our air and exacerbating environmental injustice, while letting the worst polluters off the hook.

Coal-fired power plants spew mercury into the air along with other toxic pollutants, polluting the air we breathe, our water, and even our food. Mercury pollution harms babies and fetuses by causing permanent brain damage with long term harms such as development delays, learning disabilities, and birth defects. In addition to limiting mercury pollution, MATS addresses air toxics linked to cancer and other serious health harms. Weakening the MATS would strip away \$300 million in health benefits over the course of a decade.

Due to environmental racism, communities of color are <u>more likely</u> to live near coal-fired power plants and be exposed to mercury and air toxics pollution, and communities relying on fish as a dietary staple, including many Indigenous communities, are also <u>overburdened</u> by mercury pollution. Consequently, weakening the MATS would perpetuate dangers to these people and their communities.

The Environmental Protection Agency, which you lead, is charged with protecting our environment and our health. Yet, under your stewardship, the EPA is rescinding strong air pollution standards like the MATS standard, putting people and communities at risk. Additionally, this Administration has provided waivers to dozens of power plants to let them avoid compliance with existing standards as part of a broader effort to allow industrial sources of hazardous air pollution to seek exemptions from clean air protections. This "free pass to pollute" program lets polluters release more toxic pollution and avoid accountability, harming communities nationwide who suffer from increased cancer risks and other health hazards associated with air toxics.

Your attack on MATS also goes against the wishes of the American people: according to American Lung Association research, <u>82% of voters</u> across party lines support setting stricter limits on mercury and other toxic air pollution from power plants and over <u>90,000 public</u> <u>comments</u> were submitted in support of the strengthened MATS.

By rolling back the MATS, the Trump administration is with one hand taking a swipe at the health of working people and families exposed to air pollution while providing handouts to big polluters with the other. We will not stand idly by as you rob communities across the country of cleaner air by weakening the Mercury and Air Toxics Standards and will work together to protect our health and our environment from these reckless and dangerous attacks.
